- Copies of bid were distributed at the meeting and the numbers discussed.
- The summary:
 - \$10 site for adults
 - \$5 site for children 5-17
 - \$10 feast for all
 - \$15 cabin for all
- Breakeven works out to 328
- 120 paid feast seats, plus high table (I'm planning to use the Court Hall for feast)
- *Nikulai made a motion to allocate \$6,675 for Ymir. This motion was seconded.*
- *30 voted yes – 0 no.*

Serfs Uprising Event – Rory

- Proposed Baronial event for November 16 (weekend between Phoenix Eye and Holiday Faire). Will be at Optimist Farm. Just over 100 for the break even. Total expenses for event: \$2,175.00. Fees: \$12 per adult & \$10 for feast. Event will have fighting, A&S, and feast.
- **It was discussed to call the event “Serfs Up”.**
- *A motion was made to allocate \$2,175 for this event. This motion was seconded.*
- *29 voted yes – 0 no*

Althing:

This is the 2nd Althing. First was held in January. This is a time to discuss ideas & grievances in the group. No decisions being made, just open discussion.

It was asked if anyone was interested in instrument making classes.

Marshal Activities:

- It was asked if there was a plan for the Barony at Pennsic in regards to fighting. There are no major plans at **the moment (other than we're fighting)**.
- There will be a wagon available at the camp to help carry items to and from the encampment & fighting field. There will be a schedule up in the camp regarding the departing times of the wagon.
- Discussion over the minimal number of fighters coming out to the Baronial practices and asked for opinions on how to possibly change this.
 - * A&S classes or workshops during the practice to help attract families of fighters
 - * Have a practice focused on a certain type of fighting or a special guest
 - * Send out a special invitation to groups
 - * Report on the lists (Keep, Facebook, etc) regarding all the cool things that happen at the practice.
 - * Mentoring opportunities with new fighters – remember to follow up with newer members
 - * Socialize/go out to dinner after practice
 - * Use the Windlore to share & distribute information about what is going on during the practices.
 - * At local practices, remember to remind fighters about the Baronial practice, see if you can get folks to commit to coming, see if anyone needs to share rides, etc.

Youth Activities

- Currently there is no Chancellor of Youth Activities for the Barony
- Trying to have more activities that involve the entire family (looking for ideas).
- Should we have some more activities for the older kids? It was suggested to ask that age group what they want and to maybe get one of those kids to organize things at events.
- Do we want any Pennsic camp kid activities, like story time?
- Puppet shows before court have been popular with the kids. Getting the older kids involved in puppet shows or theater improve might be a good idea

A&S

- Lots of classes at fighter practices, art nights, canton meetings, workshops
- Let Helwynn know about the classes so they can be published in the Windlore
- There used to be a subpage on the Baronial website dedicated to A&S, is there still an interest in this? Artisans can share handouts or link to personal pages, etc.
- Are we interested in a list of teachers in the Barony? Sophie is planning on working on this project.

It was discussed how a lot of the same people always volunteer and we need to work on getting others to help out and volunteer as well.

- Remember to mentor others. Offer to help run an activity/event but have someone less experience actually be the one in charge. So you can help if needed but give them the experience & opportunity to take charge.
- Find opportunities for newcomers to participate.

On Saturday June 15th at NC State Fairgrounds in Raleigh, NC several Baronial members demonstrated their skills at 2013 Maker Faire North Carolina.

From the NC Maker Faire web site “Every year at Maker Faire North Carolina Makers, Crafters, Inventors, Evil Geniuses, Scientists and Artists come together for a day of family-friendly fun and inspiration. From home-made cookies to home-made robots, Maker Faire: NC promises something for everyone in a showcase of the American creative spirit.”



Lady Helywynn Ivelchild demonstrated spinning with her spinning wheel. Gwyneth merch Maccsen greeted Faire attendees and explained spinning and weaving. Baroness la Anna Kazimova demonstrated card weaving and greeted Faire attendees. She also explained spinning, weaving and calligraphy to the audience. She invited participants to try their hand at calligraphy on a sample parchment sheet. Mistress Sunneva de Cleia demonstrated illumination on a current SCA scroll along the documentation on a medieval illumination that inspired this scroll.

Baroness Adriana la Bretonne greeted Faire attendees while she braided a cord on her lucet. Baron Rufus Barbarossa greeted Faire attendees and explained SCA rapier and heavy combat armour statically displayed. Bumba was a gentleman with helping setting up and taking down the SCA Faire booth. He entertained the crowd with picture and stories about the Pennsic War.

Roses at Day by the Black Sea

Those who stayed for feast at the recent Day by the Black Sea event may have noticed the roses in the bowls on each table. These roses came from my garden and I thought I might give you some information about the different varieties I brought.

The first thing I should mention is that all of the roses I brought were post-period varieties. While I do grow some varieties that were grown in period, none of them were in bloom at the time. One of the significant difference between period roses and those we commonly grow today is that period varieties, with only one or two exceptions, only bloom once a year while most modern roses bloom continually throughout the growing season. Some people think it strange to grow roses that only blooms once a year, given the prolific blooming of most of the roses we see today, but we do grow other plants that have a single annual bloom period. Azaleas, most bulbs like tulips and daffodils, and flowering trees like dogwood and cherry also bloom only once in a growing season, and we still choose to plant them. In addition, almost all the roses, period and modern, are hybrids, even plants that are classified as “species roses”. Species roses are called by their scientific name and are examples of roses collected from where they were indigenous or have naturalized. They tend to breed true, which is to say, if you plant the seeds of a species rose, you should get plants that look like the parent.



Sourvneir de la Malmaison (Bourbon rose)

Of the blooms I brought to the event, the variety that I brought the most of was Souvenir de la Malmaison. This Bourbon rose has white to pale pink, very double (which means it has a LOT of petals) blossoms with a cupped or flat, quartered bloom, and a strong fragrance. “Bourbon” refers to the fact that roses of this class were originally discovered on Ile de Bourbon (currently the island of Réunion in the Indian Ocean). The original hybrids from which this class of roses developed were a natural cross between *Rosa chinensis* (imported from China) and *R. damascena* (imported from Europe). The bush I have is actually a climbing variation of Souvenir de la Malmaison. Actually the word “climbing” is a bit a misnomer when it comes to roses. A “climbing” rose really just means that the plant produces very long canes. Unlike vines and ivy and the like, roses do not have any way to attach themselves to structures, though the large prickles (what are commonly referred to as “thorns”) do

have a tendency to hook or catch on things like the bark on trunks of trees or the branches of other shrubs. In this way, the long canes appear to “climb” up or over things.

Francis Dubreuil (Tea rose)

The Francis Dubreuil rose is a Tea rose and was introduced in 1894. This class of roses developed in the 19th century from specimens brought to Europe from Asia. It is called a tea rose because its fragrance is said to smell like tea. Tea roses are less cold tolerant so grow best in USDA zone 7 or higher, which means Atlantia is about as far north as these roses grow well. This rose bush tends to not grow very large (3ft or so) but I have been growing this rose in a pot so it has not gotten even that big. As a result, my bush tends to produce blooms only one or two at a time.

Cardinal de Richelieu (gallica, Parmentier, pre 1847) Cardinal de Richelieu is a gallica rose, which makes it closer to a period rose than the other varieties I brought to the event. Gallica roses are native to Europe and have been grown since Greek and Roman times. Still, this rose is a hybrid gallica developed in the mid 19th century, probably with a china rose as one parent. However, it retains the gallica trait of only blooming once during the year. When it does bloom, it is prolific. The flowers are a really deep purple and that make it stand out.

Crépuscule (Noisette, 1904)

The bloom of this rose is a pale apricot color. The stems of the blooms are pretty short and not strong so the blooms tend to “droop” from the branches. The class of rose, Noisette, was developed near Charleston SC in the 19th century and is named after the brothers who created the first hybrid of this class. However, this particular rose was actually hybridized by Francis Dubreuil, for whom one of the other roses I brought to the event was named. Crépuscule is a prolific bloomer and repeatedly blooms over the year. Like the Tea roses, it is not cold hardy so we really only see it in warmer climates, like the South. My bush is about 5 ft high and 6 ft in diameter.

Secret's Out! (hybrid tea)

This rose is a true modern rose, a Hybrid Tea. This class of roses is probably the most widely cultivated rose since most florist roses are hybrid teas. This is what most people think of when one talks about roses. This rose bush is one of six in large pots by my kitchen door. It was one of the bushes that I grew then transported across the state for my wedding in 2011. 'Secret's Out!' is a white rose has the characteristics of its class: Large solitary blooms on long straight stiff stems. The bloom itself has the urn or vase shape where the petals all swirl around a central point and has a good fragrance. The cultivar was discovered in 2009 right here in the barony, at Witherspoon Rose Culture in Durham, as a "sport" of 'Secret'. A sport is a spontaneous mutation where a bloom (or a cane) on a bush show a different color, shape, or size. When propagated by grafting or rooting, the change is maintained, though there are cases where parts of the new bush "sport back" to the original form. In the case of this rose, the "parent" rose, 'Secret', has pink blend coloring while 'Secret's Out!' has solid white blooms.

If anyone has any questions about roses, period or otherwise, I am happy to talk to you about them.

A single word can change the entire tone of your message. In this case, newbie(s) versus newcomer(s)...

How does the use of either term change the tone of the message?

Which term presents a welcoming tone to you?

Did either of the terms create a feeling of contempt, belittling, or the appearance that the intended recipient was being talked down to?

The term newbie, used by many in the SCA as a way to distinguish newcomers, has a derogatory meaning to many people. But before discussing this in-depth, let's take a peek at some of the definitions for newbie and newcomer.

Contemporary use can particularly refer to a beginner or new user of computers, often concerning Internet activity, such as online gaming[1] or Linux use.[2][3] It can have derogatory connotations, but is also often used for descriptive purposes only, without a value judgment.”
